

Shared need Policy instruments





Implementation phases:

- Core phase: Achieving policy improvement through learning
 - Exchanging experiencies (mandatory)
 - Testing innovative approaches (optional)
- Follow-up phase: Monitoring policy improvements and their effects
 - Monitoring the first effects of policy improvements and the implementation of the action plans for policy changes (mandatory)
 - Exchanging experiences and testing new approaches (optional)




Policy learning platform:

Small projects – definition

- To facilitate easier access to the Programme and a simplified project implementation
- To attract organisations that are underrepresented, have not participated for a longer period or never before
- To target mainly local and regional authorities as well as NGOs
- To be implemented under certain conditions that differ from regular projects
 - limited budget
 - limited implementation period
 - simplified cost options exclusively





Small projects – set-up

- b) Partnership composition
- Primarily local and regional authorities and NGOs
- Newcomers and "absentees"
- Size: same requirements as for regular cooperation projects
- c) Budget
- up to EUR 500,000 overall budget for a single project
- d) Implementation time
- Up to two years






2. What are the aims for 2021?

- Agreement on programme budget
- Approval and submission of Programme document
- Approval of MCS-Agreement
- Agreement on implementing provisions (= Programme Manual)
- Discussion on application rounds, timeline, assessment criteria
- Programme kick-off event(s) (virtual tbc.)
- Launch of first application round(s) at the end of 2021

Interregional innovation investments: I3 intends to support regional innovation stakeholders, well integrated in the regional innovation ecosystems, providing funding for mature joint innovation projects organised in value-chain investment portfolios.

• Strand 1 targeting well-developed ecosystems and focusing on the part of the value chains where weakness or market failures are identified (fragmentation, insufficient interconnection, financial or technological gap, interregional valley of death for the uptake of innovative technologies) and a solution could come from the interregional triple/quadruple helix cooperation.

Strand 2 targeting less developed regions and focusing on reinforcing the regional innovation ecosystems, unlocking under utilised capacities, which could reinforce EU value chains.
